Chapter 1 About CICTAB

1.1 PROFILE :

At the instance of FAO CICTAB was set up by Ministry of Cooperation (previously Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare), Govt. of India as an autonomous institution with its head quarters at Vaikunth Mehta National Institute of Cooperative Management, University Road, Pune 411 007 (India), in January, 1983.

CICTAB became operational, initially for four countries of the region, viz. Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka and India. Subsequently in the year 1991, General Council of CICTAB decided to revive the development of CICTAB activities as focal centre of HRD efforts in the relevant fields for all the countries of the SAARC region.

CICTAB was organised on the lines of the recommendations of FAO Mission on CICTAB (Chairman, B. Venkatapiah, formerly Dy. Governor of Reserve Bank of India and with endorsement of Government consultations held at Pune of four initial member countries of CICTAB, viz. Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka and India.

1.2 SCOPE AND FUNCTIONS

While conceived essentially as a sub-regional centre for Nepal, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and India, subsequently extending its scope to all the countries of SAARC Region, it is also expected that CICTAB will provide an effective forum for exchange of experience in agricultural banking and related fields between different developing countries in Asia and Africa. CICTAB's role, thus, is comprehensive and crucial but catalytic in nature.

The functions envisaged for CICTAB are defined in terms of its role and also of the countries it is expected to serve. CICTAB's functions are thus (i) training of personnel in relevant spheres and (ii) serve as a forum for exchange of experience among developmental functionaries.

1.3 OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

One of the distinguishing features of CICTAB is focus of its activities on programmes and practices relating to rural development. CICTAB, therefore, endeavours, through its programmes to help develop integrated management of organisations and institutions concerned with promoting and financing rural development.

In terms of its objectives, activities envisaged for CICTAB are:

- a. To actively promote and strengthen national systems for training in agricultural banking - credit and other organisations engaged in rural financing and development.
- b. To conduct training courses/workshops/seminars in India or other countries of the region on various aspects of Agricultural/Rural Financing and Development.

Chapter 2 ORGANISATION

CICTAB is registered as an autonomous institution with promoter members as listed in Memorandum of Association. As per the decision taken in the Managing Committee and General Council CICTAB has two newly added institutions, Institute of Rural Management, Anand, India & RMDC Laghubitta Bittiya Sanstha Ltd., Nepal from the year 2019-20.

Currently, CICTAB has 36 members who have subscribed to the membership of CICTAB with country-wise break-up as follows :

Chapter 3 PROGRAMMES AND PARTICIPANTS

CICTAB's activities relate to training personnel so as to assist them in solving the problems relating to promoting and financing rural development activities as also regarding the innovative and multi-disciplinary types of Rural Development Projects and Programmes.

The countries in the region participating in CICTAB programmes have more or less common features and comparable experience and problems in their rural economy and in the various development programmes undertaken by them. The importance of personnel development in evolving a viable institutional framework for executing rural development programmes, particularly for the benefit of the rural poor recognised by all concerned.

Participants for CICTAB's training programmes and other allied activities are senior personnel in related Departments of Government, central banks, cooperative and rural development financing institutions, Banks dealing with policies and programmes of their respective institutions and trainers from national level or regional level training institutions concerned with training of personnel from Rural Financing and Development Organisations.

CICTAB acknowledges the comprehensive support of the member institutions in member countries in sponsoring/collaborating in the successful conduct of the training programmes for the benefit of participants from agricultural banking, cooperatives and rural development institutions in member countries and other countries of SAARC Region.

Since its inception in 1983, CICTAB has successfully completed 336 International Training Programs until March 2021.

Training Programmes conducted in 2020-2021

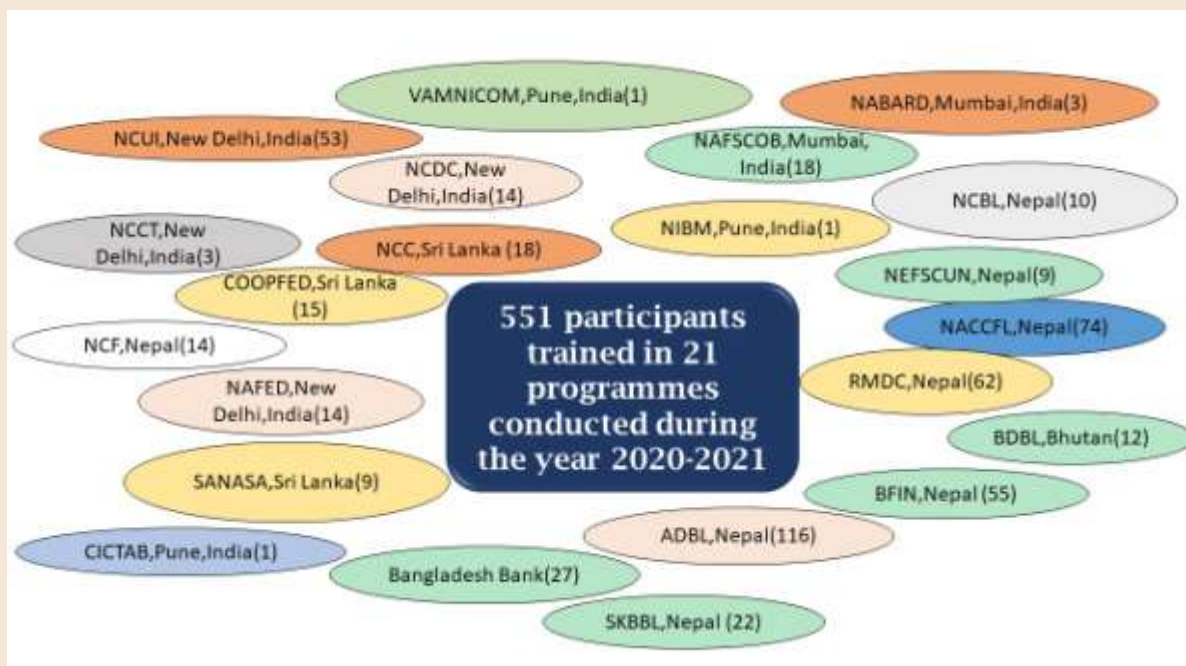

Chapter 4

**AN OVERVIEW OF PROGRESS AND GLIMPSES OF CICTAB ACTIVITIES
1983-84 to 2020-2021**



1. NATIONAL WORKSHOPS :

FAO Mission Report (March 1980) had indicated a broad framework of activities for CICTAB especially with reference to the part it can play to help build up a National system of training for each of the participating countries. While discussing the measures for promoting national system of training it was indicated that one of the main responsibilities of CICTAB would be to assist and guide the countries in the sub-region for developing and strengthening their National systems of training so that cadres of trained professionals are built up to meet adequately the emerging needs of development oriented agricultural banking.

Objective was to help develop a comprehensive national system covering both cooperative and commercial banks. This would necessitate national level workshops for assessing the present gaps in training arrangements and identifying the measures to be taken to develop well-knit and purposeful national training systems. The first such workshop was held in India.

In view of these objectives, National Workshops designs were formulated as under:

- (i) Reviewing training arrangements obtaining in the country for personnel connected with rural banking and credit in commercial banks, cooperatives and specialised institutions.
- (ii) Consider such arrangements in light of the objectives, needs and other aspects including policies and programmes of rural development such as those concerned with larger production on the one hand and the small producer on the other.
- (iii) Suggesting framework for bringing these arrangements into a National system of training such as would adequately fulfill the objectives and policies which underlie agricultural programmes and rural development with particular reference to strengthen and develop National training system as :
 - (a) Strengthening and developing multi-level network of training arrangements/institutions with appropriate linkages and coordination at various levels(National, Intermediate and Field);
 - (b) A central arrangement to (a) to design various programmes on the basis of job analysis of different cadres and levels of banking personnel;
 - (c) to organise training of the faculty and help in the preparation of course material;
 - (d) to develop teaching methods; and (d) to evaluate training programmes.

Accordingly, CICTAB organised four National Workshop in India, Sri Lanka, Nepal and Bangladesh as under :

- (1) National Workshop to review training arrangements in India was organised from 12-15 February 1986 at VM National Institute of Co-operative Management, Pune The Workshop was attended by 55 participants representing government departments connected with cooperation and rural development, National level training institutions, commercial banks, regional rural banks, state co-operative banks, National Cooperative Agriculture and Rural Development Banks Federation, National Council for Cooperative Training, FAO and APRACA.
- (2) National Workshop to review training arrangements in Sri Lanka was organised with Central Bank of Sri Lanka as lead institution from 31 October to 03 November 1986. The National Workshop was attended by 22 participants drawn from agricultural banks, cooperatives and government

departments connected with agricultural and co-operative/rural development.

- (3) National Workshop to review training arrangements in Nepal was organised on 30-31 May 1988 with Agricultural Credit Institute of Agricultural Development Bank, Nepal as lead institution. The Workshop was attended by 23 participants representing National level training institutions, Nepal Rastra Bank, Rastriya Banijya Bank, Agricultural Development Bank and representatives of Ministry of Agricultural Finance, Rural Development and Co-operatives.
- (4) National Workshop to review training arrangements in Bangladesh was organised on 3-4 April 1989 with Training Academy of Bangladesh Bank as lead institution. 34 participants representing National level training institutions, agricultural financing banks, commercial banks, National level Rural Development Board, Bangladesh Institute of Bank Management and Government Departments connected with agricultural financing, cooperatives and rural development.

2. COLLABORATIVE ACTIVITIES - PROGRAMMES :

(i) Survey of Self-Help Groups :

At the instance of APRACA the member institutions of APRACA in India were to undertake survey of self-help groups with a view to establish their linkages with the financial institutions. As a part of collaborative contribution of CICTAB in conducting these surveys and join the steering committee which was to coordinate and consolidate their survey reports of voluntary agencies/self help groups in various parts of the country CICTAB in turn had requested VAMNICOM, Pune to undertake the study on behalf of CICTAB. Accordingly, the survey of self-help groups/voluntary agencies in Tamilnadu and Kerala were undertaken by the faculty of VAMNICOM on behalf of CICTAB in 1986. The report prepared on the basis of this survey has been incorporated in the country report on the survey by NABARD for APRACA.

(ii) Country Plan of Study Visits by APRACA members in India :

It was decided in the meeting of the APRACA member institutions of India held at NABARD, Bombay on 15 May 1987 that CICTAB may assist in preparing the country plan of study visits by Indian member institutions during the years 1987 and 1988. CICTAB had undertaken to prepare such programmes on behalf of the member institutions of India as a part of its collaborative efforts in APRACA activities.

CICTAB prepared a detailed plan of study institution-wise and subject-wise on the lines of the focus of study during these visits as indicated by APRACA and requested the member institutions in India to indicate the number of representatives proposed to be deputed for study visits as well as to indicate the areas/institutions and countries they would like to depute their members of study.

CICTAB compiled and classified the proposals as received in terms of the countries/institutions/areas and number of persons to visit group of countries and sent these details to NABARD for convening the meeting of the member institutions to finalise the actual programme of study visits as well as the allocation of APRACA assistance to member institutions of India for undertaking the study visits.

(iii) Consultation for preparing Course Outline and Material for South Asian Trainers Training Course :

It was decided in the APRACA meeting of Indian member institutions held at NABARD, Bombay on 15 May 1987, that CICTAB should be designated as focal point in India for preparatory work for the above consultation and also for subsequently conducting South Asian Trainers Training Programme of APRACA.

In terms of the above decision and as part of collaborative efforts towards conducting APRACA activities, CICTAB had constituted a team of training experts consisting of representatives from VAMNICOM, CAB, NIBM, NABARD and SBI. CICTAB has collected training material in respect of trainers training programmes from these institutions. The compiled training material was considered at the consultation of trainers organised by APRACA in collaboration with CICTAB at CAB, Pune during the period 21-25 March 1988.

(iv) At the instance of the Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India CICTAB provided academic collaboration in organising and conducting APRACA "Workshop on Linkages of Self-help Group with Banks" in the month of December 1990 at NIBM.

3. CICTAB DELEGATION'S VISITS TO MEMBER COUNTRIES

(i) DELEGATION TO NEPAL :

As per the decision of the General Council and Managing Committee of CICTAB, the programme of visit of the CICTAB Delegation to Kathmandu, Nepal was arranged

for the period 6-11 September, 1992. The objective of the delegation visit as to have an opportunity of personal dialogue and discussions with the various authorities and national level agricultural banking, cooperative and rural development institutions and their National level training organisations regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Nepal with collaborative support of these respective organisations and institutions.

CICTAB Delegation consisted of Dr. BC Sharma, IAS, the then Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Chairman, Managing Committee of CICTAB as leader of the Delegation, Shri KC Srivastava, IAS, Director and Prof. (Dr.) DR Oza, Consultant, CICTAB. During the course of the programme of visit, the Delegation had very useful discussions with the authorities of Government and National level agricultural banking and rural development institutions of Nepal.

During the course of discussions with these authorities and institutions the Delegation received very encouraging response to the request of CICTAB regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Nepal mainly for the human resource development of the functionaries in the spheres of agricultural banking, cooperatives and rural development institutions in Nepal.

(ii) DELEGATION TO SRI LANKA :

As per the decision of the General Council and Managing Committee of CICTAB the programme of visit of the CICTAB delegation to Colombo, Sri Lanka was arranged for the period from 6-12 February, 1994. The objective of the delegation visit was to have an opportunity of personal dialogue and discussions with the various authorities and National level agricultural banking, cooperative and rural development institutions and their National level training organisations regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Sri Lanka with collaborative support of these respective organisations and institutions.

CICTAB delegation consisted of Smt. Asha Das, IAS, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Chairman, Managing Committee of CICTAB as leader of the delegation, Shri KC Srivastava, IAS, Director, CICTAB, Bhagat Bista, representative of the Nepal Rastra Bank, Kathmandu, Nepal and Prof. (Dr.) DR Oza, Consultant, CICTAB. During the course of the programme of visit, the delegation had very useful discussions with the authorities of the Government and National level agricultural banking, cooperatives and rural development institutions of Sri Lanka.

During the course of discussions with these authorities and institutions the delegation received very encouraging response to the request of CICTAB regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Sri Lanka mainly for the human

resource development of the functionaries in the spheres of agricultural banking, cooperative and rural development institutions in Sri Lanka.

(iii) DELEGATION TO BANGLADESH :

CICTAB delegation to Bangladesh, consisting of Smt. Asha Das, IAS Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Chairperson, Managing Committee of CICTAB as leader of the delegation, Shri KC Srivastava, IAS, Director, CICTAB, Shri MN Caffoor, Deputy General Manager, People's Bank and Prof. (Dr.) DR Oza, Consultant, CICTAB visited Bangladesh during the period 12-18 April 1994. During the course of the programme of visit, the delegation had very useful discussions with the authorities of the Government and National level agricultural banking, cooperative and rural development institutions of Bangladesh.

(iv) DELEGATION TO MALDIVES

With a view to initiate efforts in the remaining countries of the SAARC region by arranging personal discussions with the authorities and National level institutions of Maldives to discuss various aspects of developing CICTAB activities in Maldives, the visit of CICTAB officials under the leadership of Shri Bhagat Singh, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India and Chairman, Managing Committee of CICTAB was arranged from 04-09 May, 1998. The team included, besides the Chairman, Dr. MC Bhandari, Director and Prof. (Dr.) DR Oza, Consultant of CICTAB.

During the visit, CICTAB Delegation visited all the relevant authorities and institutions including Hon'ble Minister of Fisheries and Agriculture, Republic of Maldives, Director General, Ministry of Fisheries and Agriculture, General Manager, Bank of Maldives, Director, Department of External Resources, Director, Ministry of Planning and Director Maldives Centre for Management. During the course of visit the team had very useful discussions with these respective authorities, who positively responded to the initiative of CICTAB in developing HRD activities in the spheres of agricultural banking and rural development and expressed that they would explore the possibility of helping the development of CICTAB activities in Maldives and for the relevant personnel of Maldives.

(v) DELEGATION TO BHUTAN :

With a view to have personal discussions with authorities in the Government and National level financing and development institutions/agencies in Bhutan regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Bhutan and for the personnel of Bhutan, CICTAB delegation under the leadership of Shri Bhagat Singh, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Govt.of India and Chairman, Managing Committee and

consisting of DR. BB Barik, Director, VAMNICOM and CICTAB and Dr. DR Oza, Consultant, CICTAB visited Thimphu, Bhutan for the period from 08-11 January, 2001.

The visiting team of CICTAB officials had details discussions with the authorities in respect of various aspects relating to :

- i) deputing participants to the programme being conducted by CICTAB in different countries of the SAARC Region.
- ii) sponsoring and organising need-based programmes mainly for the development of personnel of Bhutan along with participants of CICTAB countries in Bhutan and
- iii) request for formally joining the membership of CICTAB by various authorities and institutions by paying a membership of US\$ 500 and thereby join the General Council of CICTAB to guide the future development of CICTAB activities.

The delegation had a very encouraging response from these authorities and institutions visited and as a result, CICTAB has received 3 membership from Bhutan viz. (i) Ministry of Agriculture, (ii) Royal Monetary Authority and (iii) Bhutan Development Finance Corporation.

4. EXPERT GROUP TO REVIEW CICTAB PROGRAMMES :

General Council of CICTAB constituted expert group consists of Prof Dinkar Rao of NIBM, Prof. Mohanan of NIRD and Shri Srinivasan, Chief General Manager, NABARD to review the nomenclature, design and content of all the programmes being conducted by CICTAB.

Expert group considered the tabulated suggestions of member institutions of CICTAB in member countries in detail and recommended revised format of programmes.

5. Roadmap :

Centre for International Cooperation and Training in Agricultural Banking (CICTAB) under the guidance of Dr K K Tripathy, Director, CICTAB formed the Research Coordination committee in February 2020 to expand its scope in research. The idea behind the formation of this committee was to review research studies and evaluate project in the areas of rural financing, financial inclusion, rural development, cooperative development and related areas.

One of the major highlights of the roadmap was also one time financial support to the CICTAB corpus fund. Hence, member institutions like Indian Farmers Fertilizers Coop. Ltd. (IFFCO), New Delhi, National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation Ltd. (NAFED), New Delhi, Reserve Bank of India (RBI), Mumbai, Ministry of Rural Development & Panchyati Raj, Govt. of India through National Institute Rural Development & Panchayati Raj (NIRD & PR), Hyderabad and National Cooperative Union of India (NCUI), New Delhi have contributed to the corpus fund of CICTAB.

5.1 Research

The Research Coordination Committee constituted by the Director, CICTAB has decided to identify Nodal Officer from each member Institution of CICTAB to undertake the research activities. Out of 36 member Institutions, 18 institutions have identified and informed the Nodal Officer of their organization for the smooth facilitation of research activities. The list of the Nodal officer is enclosed at **Annexure IV.**

The Research Coordination Committee has approved the conduct of research project proposal on "Inclusive Growth in Indian Agriculture: Need for commercially viable and financially sustainable FPOs" .National Agriculture Cooperative Marketing Federation Ltd. (NAFED), New Delhi has agreed to meet 50% of the research project cost.Further, CICTAB has made a request to National Cooperative Union of India (NCUI), New Delhi to provide financial assistance.The Project will be completed in 15 months period with the support of NIRD & PR, Hyderabad, VAMNICOM, Pune and CICTAB.

To engage and amplify the release of Annual Reports / Cases /Research papers, carry out Documentation of best practices and timely updation on CICTAB Website, the institution has appointed one Research Associate who has been assigned the abovesaid tasks.

Chapter 4

Training Programmes : 2020-2021

During period 01.04.2020 to 31.03.2021 CICTAB has conducted 21 training programmes during the period 01.04.2020 to 31.03.2021. A Programme on "Agri Business Entrepreneurship" commenced on 5th March, 2021 and concluded on 7th August, 2021. The training programmes were conducted in online mode due to

unprecedented pandemic situation and one training programme conducted in online as well as offline mode in February, 2021 at Kolhapur, Maharashtra, India.

(1) International Online Programme on “Renewable Energy Management for Cooperatives” (22nd – 24th July, 2020) at VAMNICOM,Pune

International Online Programme on “Renewable Energy Management for Cooperatives” was organized during 22nd – 24th July, 2020.

A total number of 20 participants from India (15) and from Nepal (5) participated in the programme, which was partly sponsored by CICTAB, Pune.

The programme was inaugurated by Dr K K Tripathy, Director, CICTAB & VAMNICOM in presence of Shri Pradip Kumar Das, Chairman & Managing Director, IREDA and Dr. D. Ravi, Consultant, CICTAB.

The training curriculum included sessions on Challenges in Renewable Energy, Effects on Renewable energy during COVID-19 and post COVID-19 healthcare in Asia-Africa, Community bio-gas plant and sharing of success stories by industry experts of successful renewable energy units such as Mailhem Bio Energy project, Praj Industries and Samuchit Enviro Tech. All the participants also took part in the the country paper presentation.

The participants expressed their satisfaction with the faculty facilitation skills, rich knowledge sharing and effective use of training methods. Also the participants found training material informative and handouts very useful.

(2) International Online Programme on “Agri Value Chain Financing” (10th -12th August 2020) – (MoA-VAMNICOM-CICTAB) at VAMNICOM,Pune

The International Programme on “Agri Value Chain Financing” was scheduled during 10th- 12th August 2020.

A total number of 21 participants from Nepal (18) and from India (3) participated in the programme, which was in collaboration with VAMNICOM,Pune under the sponsorship of Ministry of Agriculture and Farmer’s Welfare, Government of India.

The programme was inaugurated by Dr K K Tripathy, Director, CICTAB & VAMNICOM in presence Dr. D. Ravi, Consultant, CICTAB.

The three-day training programme included sessions focusing on the Agri value chain financing with reference to Banks, FPOs & MNCs. The industry experts also sensitized the participants on sustainable supply chain model, the risk involved in rural and agriculture lending, warehouse collateral management and initiatives of smart project with reference to agri value chain financing.

All participants felt that the training useful in many ways and appreciated the topic selections for sessions and content materials.

(3) International Online Programme on “Adopting Area Based Integrated Approach for Inclusive Cooperative Development of NCDC's ICDP Scheme” on 24 - 28 August, 2020

The International Online Programme on “Adopting Area Based Integrated Approach for Inclusive Cooperative Development of NCDC's ICDP Scheme” in Indian context was conducted on 24th-28th August 2020 hosted by LINACRD, Gurgaon, Haryana in collaboration with CICTAB, Pune.

A total number of 12 participants from Nepal participated in the programme.

The content of the programme mainly included sessions by various Faculty members from VAMNICOM, NCDC & LINAC on the following topics :

- About NCDC
- Concept & formulation of ICDP
- Experiences on the impact of ICDPs in India
- Market Research for Business plan Development
- Identification of sub-project opportunities, generating proposals and data requirements
- HRD & Training under ICDP approach & strategy
- Efficiencies through the use of computers- MS Excel, Power point
- Country paper presentation

The participants were pleased about the about the experiences shared with them. Also they expressed the programme was very useful and informative.

(4) International Online Programme on “Development of

Managerial Skills for Agricultural Co-operatives and Rural Financing Institutions” (21st- 25th Sept 2020) at NCDC - LINACRD, Gurgaon, Haryana

The content of the programme mainly included sessions by various Faculty members from VAMNICOM, LINAC, NCDC, ICA, DCCB, on the following topics :

- Success in Primary Cooperatives – Cases & Lessons
- Market Research for Tools for Business decisions
- Identifying business opportunities
- Cooperative Development Strategies- International Experiences
- Integrated Cooperative Development- Approach & Experiences
- Managing Rural Credit Operations including role of federal bodies
- Self Help Groups- Integration with Cooperatives & Impact
- Governance & computerization initiatives for RFIs/Cooperatives
- Country paper presentation

(5) International Online Programme on “Skilling Livelihood and Financial Inclusion” (19th-22nd October 2020) at NIRD, Hyderabad

the rural poverty.

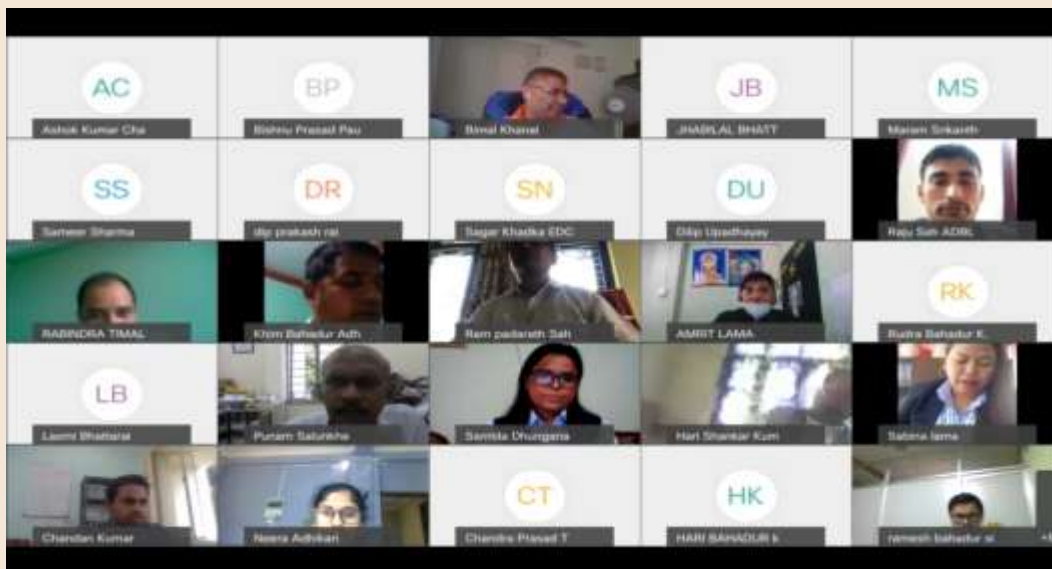

Dr K K Tripathi Director,VAMNICOM and CICTAB inaugurated the training programme where he shared with the participants the relevance of conducting the particular training programme. He also advised the participants to utilise the CICTAB platform to interact with each other.

The content of the programme mainly included sessions Cooperative Governance, Overview of Indian Cooperative Movement and Role of NCUI, Financial Decision & Managerial Decision making tools, Information Technology Governance for Cooperatives and RFIs, Detecting Financial Frauds and the concept of Fintech.

VAMNICOM's in-house faculty members and a pool of experts, from other institutes such as NCUI,IRMA, Cosmos Cooperative Bank, Hi-Tech Agro Energy Pvt. Ltd who are subject matter specialists-cum-practitioners in the areas of cooperative governance and management of financial & managerial decisions contributed to the programme.

Dr D Ravi Faculty,VAMNICOM & Consultant,CICTAB moderated the country paper presentation session. The participants from different regions/organizations shared their experiences which was very insightful.

The programme was well appreciated by the participants in the feedback session.

(7) International Online Programme on "Digitalization and Financial Inclusion" (for CEOs and Senior Executives) (9th-11th Nov 2020) at (CICTAB-RBI-CAB)

The International Online Programme on "Digitalization and Financial Inclusion" (for CEOs and Senior Executives) was organized during 9th-11th

Nov 2020 which was sponsored by Reserve Bank of India and hosted by College of Agricultural Bank, Pune.

A total number of 57 participants from Nepal (42) and from India (15) participated in the programme.

The programme was inaugurated in presence of the dignitaries from CAB and CICTAB.

The program focused on sensitizing the participants with the knowledge of various initiatives on digital financial inclusion and use of technology in promoting financial inclusion in India . The sessions in this training programme therefore focused on the following topics : Concepts,Guidelines,Issues & Challenges of Financial Inclusion,Insights from International Cooperation towards Digital Financial Inclusion & Access(G 20 High Level Principles of Digital Financial Inclusion & Cross Country Experience from Global Finex Database 2017), Overview of cooperative structure in India & role of Cooperative banks in financial inclusion, Financial Inclusion through Group lending : SHG & JLG Model, Use of Technology & recent innovations in payment & settlement system,OECD core competencies on financial literacy,Consumer Protection & Financial Inclusion & Risks in Digital Banking.

The participants also made country paper presentations on the status of digitalization & financial inclusion in their country, moderated by Dr D Ravi, Faculty,VAMNICOM & Consultant,CICTAB.

The three-day programme ended on a positive note with noteworthy feedback from all the participants.

(8) International Online Programme on "Project Approach to Cooperative Development: Sharing of NCUI Cooperative Education Field Projects" (24th-27th Nov, 2020) at NCUI, Delhi

Project Approach to Cooperative Development : Sharing experience of NCUI Cooperative Education Field Projects", an international online Training Programme was organised by CICTAB and NCUI from 24-27 November 2020.

It was a four day online programme attended by 38 participants out of which 32 were from Nepal and 8 were from India.

NCUI in collaboration with CICTAB organised this unique online international training programme on 'Project Approach to Cooperative Development' for the first time.

Dr K K Tripathi Director of VAMNICOM and CICTAB addressed the participants at the inaugural session of the Training Programme where he shared with the participants the requirement and necessity of such practical oriented programme in CICTAB calendar and advised the participants to utilise the particular platform to interact with each other. Dr D Ravi, Faculty, VAMNICOM & Consultant, CICTAB, Dr. K N Sinha Executive Director of IR and Projects, NCUI & Mr Ritesh Dey, Director, International Relations NCUI also continuously interacted with the participants.

The content of the programme mainly revolved around the experiences of the six identified Project Officers of NCUI field projects from different parts of India. They shared their experiences with the participants through online lecture, power point presentation and videos of the different developmental activities being carried by the project personnel. The formation of credit linkage SHGs and registering them as Cooperative society, revitalization of weak Cooperatives including PACS, income generating activities like mushroom cultivation, namkeen making and marketing to augment the income of the family members of Cooperatives were also shared with the participants during these practical sessions. Activities such as integrated farming, promotion of horticulture and medicinal plants which are directly linked with the livelihood generation was of great significance to the participants. These project officers also shared about many social and community development programmes that has been carried to improve the lives of rural communities.

Apart from these relevant experiencing sharing sessions, lectures were also arranged for the participants by faculty members/industry experts of premier institutions like NIRD & PR Hyderabad, NIBM & Vamnicom Pune, FPO and NCUI.

Dr D Ravi Faculty, VAMNICOM & Consultant, CICTAB moderated the country paper presentation session. The participants from different regions/organizations shared their experiences which was very insightful. The different lady mobilizers/instructors from different states of India shared their success stories and motivational journey. The most commendable part about these success stories were the inspiration to progress and work harder in life. This session was lauded by all the participants.

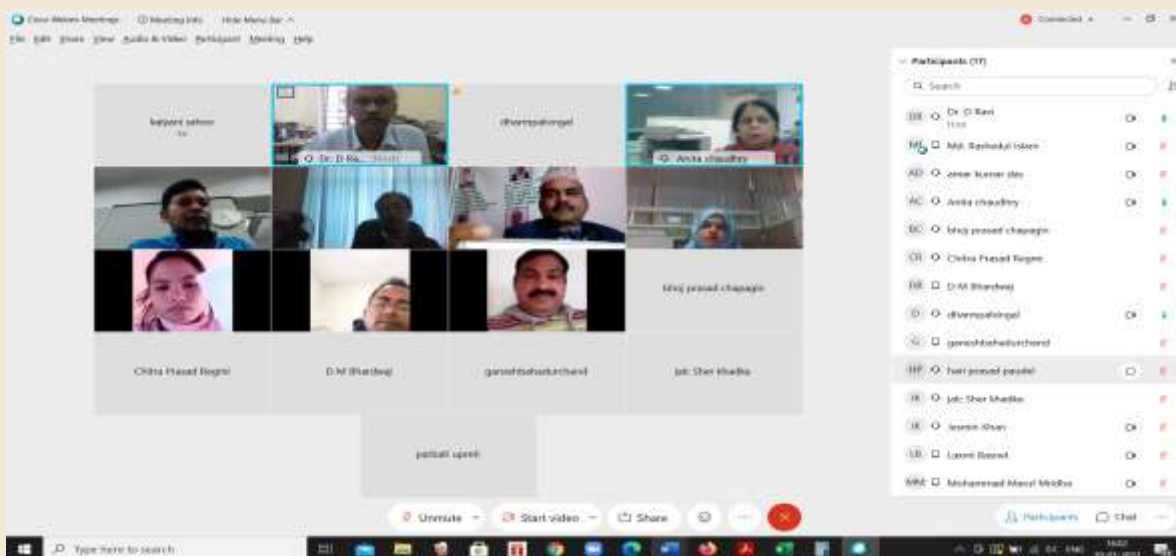
Corporation - Role, functions and activities and IFS Model for doubling farmers income.

A total number of 19 participants attended the on-line programme from three countries viz., Sri Lanka (12),Nepal(03), and Bangladesh(04).

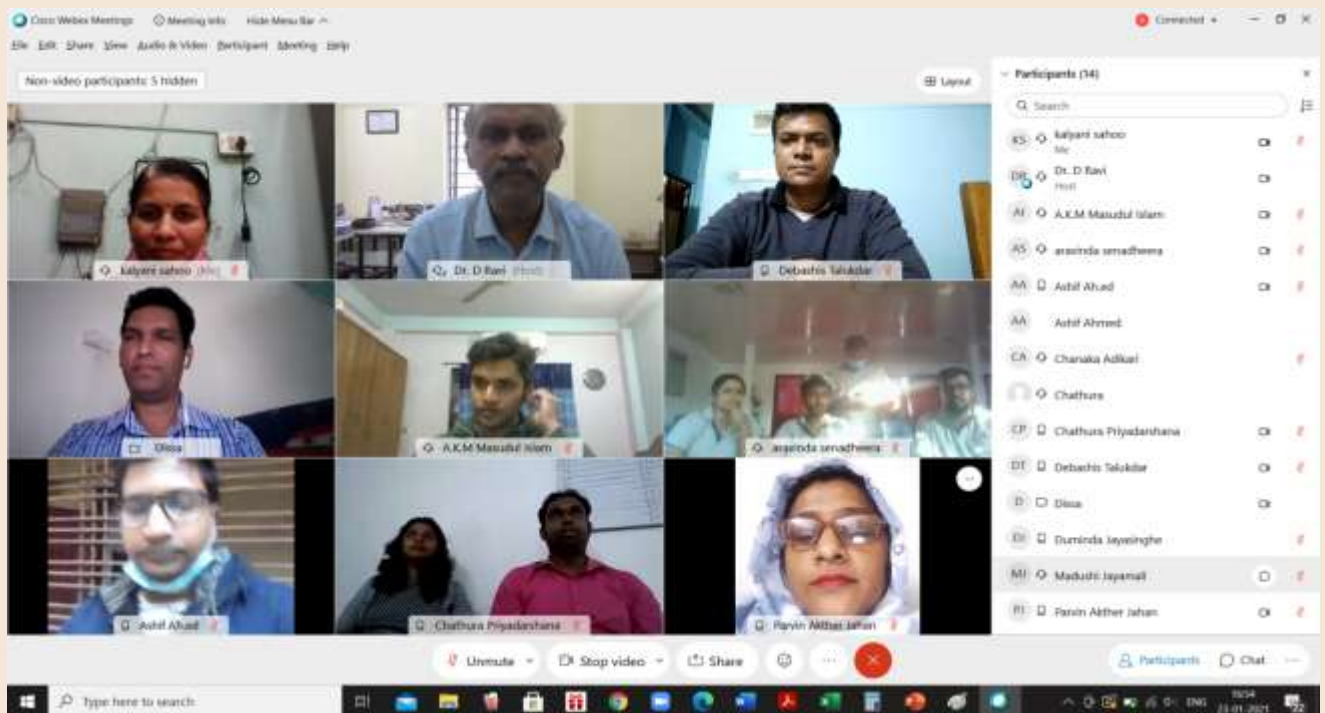
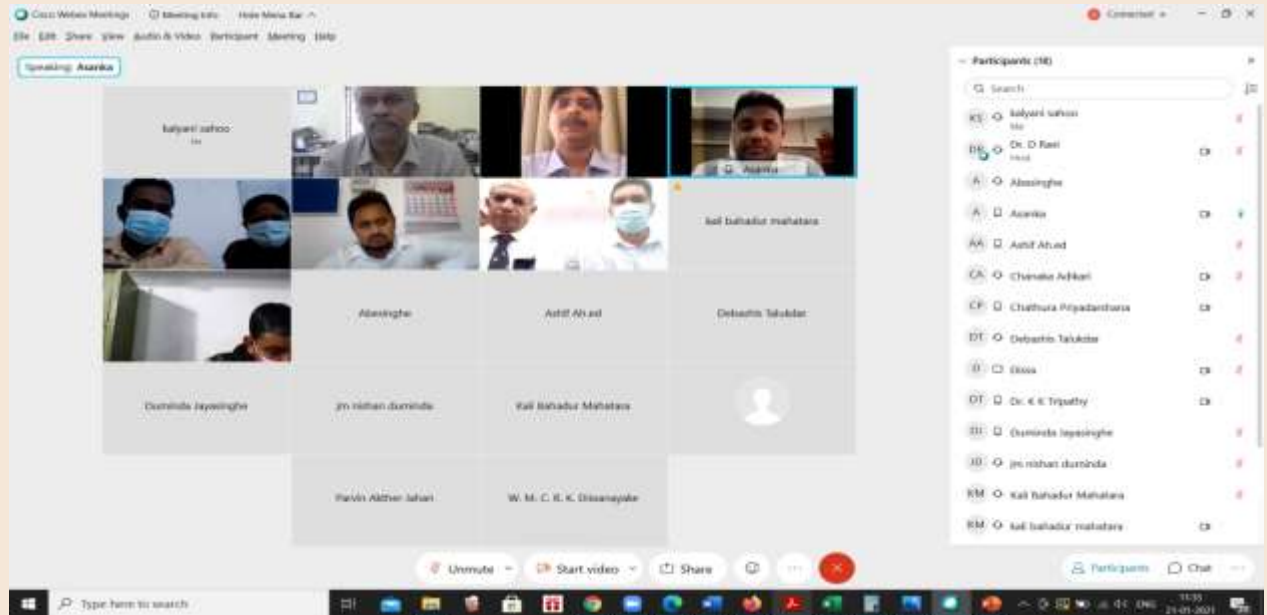

Tripathi, Director, VAMNICOM and CICTAB, D Ravi, Faculty, VAMNICOM & Consultant, CICTAB, Dr Y S Patil, Associate Professor, VAMNICOM, and other faculty members, staff of CICTAB & YCSRDR.



Kolhapur was chosen for this particular exposure visit to cooperative business models because the city has history of many successful and innovative cooperatives engaged in the marketing of agricultural produce. To witness the journey of such establishments, visits to were planned to the following places :

(a)The Kolhapur District Central Cooperative Bank Ltd., Kolhapur

The group visited the The Kolhapur District Central Cooperative Bank Ltd., on 3rd February 2021. Dr A B Mane,CEO,KDCC bank sensitized the participants about the various activities of the bank and the contribution of the bank in providing various services to the entire cooperative sector with its 191 branches in the entire Kolhapur district.



(b)Shriram Multipurpose Cooperative Society Ltd., KasbaBawda

The group also visited the Shriram Multipurpose Cooperative Society Ltd., KasbaBawda, on 3rd February 2021. This society is a very old, unique and one of its kind cooperative society which has been carrying out different types of activities. The group was also given a complete tour of the society and it was commendable to see multiple activities such as milk diary, small flour mill, grocery shop, printing press, warehouse for wheat & pulses, huge community hall for functions and giving out three tractors on rental basis in a particular compound.



(c) Srivardhan Biotech

The group visited the Srivardhan Biotech, on 4th February 2021. Srivardhan Bio - tech, is cut flower project established during the year 1997-98 by

Shri Appasaheb S. R. Patil, chairman of most successful co-operative sugar factory of the country. This particular project was notable due to its infrastructure and marketing aspects. The project was spread over 22 hectares and that too under greenhouse / shed-house cultivation of mainly Roses, Gerbera, and Capsicum. The project also provides employment including the transportation to 300 people of nearby villagers out of which 200 are women.



(d) Shree Datta Shetkari Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana Ltd., Shirol

The group also visited the Shree Datta Shetkari Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana in Shirol, on 4th February 2021. This particular sugar factory is one of the most successful sugar cooperatives in Maharashtra. The plant manager gave the group a tour of the factory starting from the processing of the sugarcane to the final product which involved machinery with huge capacity.

(e) Warana Cooperative Consumer Stores Ltd. Warnanagar

The group then visited the Warana Cooperative Consumer Stores Ltd. in Warnanagar, on 4th February 2021. The purpose of visit to this consumer store was quite important as this was the first consumer cooperative store, set up in 1978 to meet the household requirements of the rural population.



(f)Gokul Dairy

The last visit of the group was the Gokul Dairy on 5th February 2021. After the tour of the plant which helped us witness the amount of stages milk goes through, before it is actually ready for consumption. Post the tour, Shri D V Ghanekar interacted with the group regarding the issues , challenges and opportunities of Gokul Dairy and the dairy cooperative as a whole as well.

The second half of the last day of the visit was dedicated to experience sharing & discussions about visited cooperatives by all the participants. The key takeaways was shared by each of the group and was quite astute.

The programme was successful and was well appreciated by the participants.

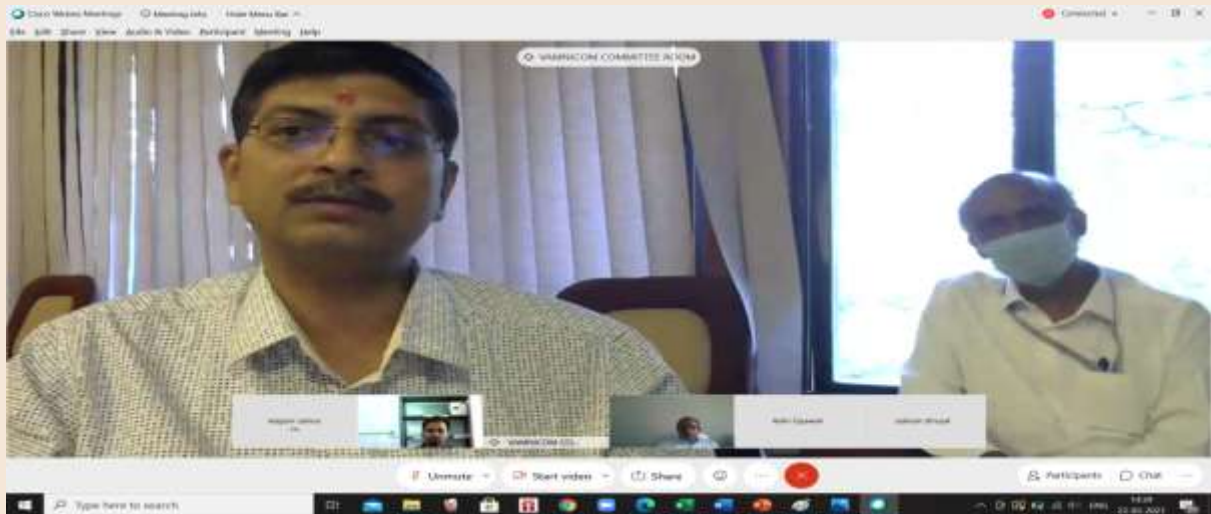

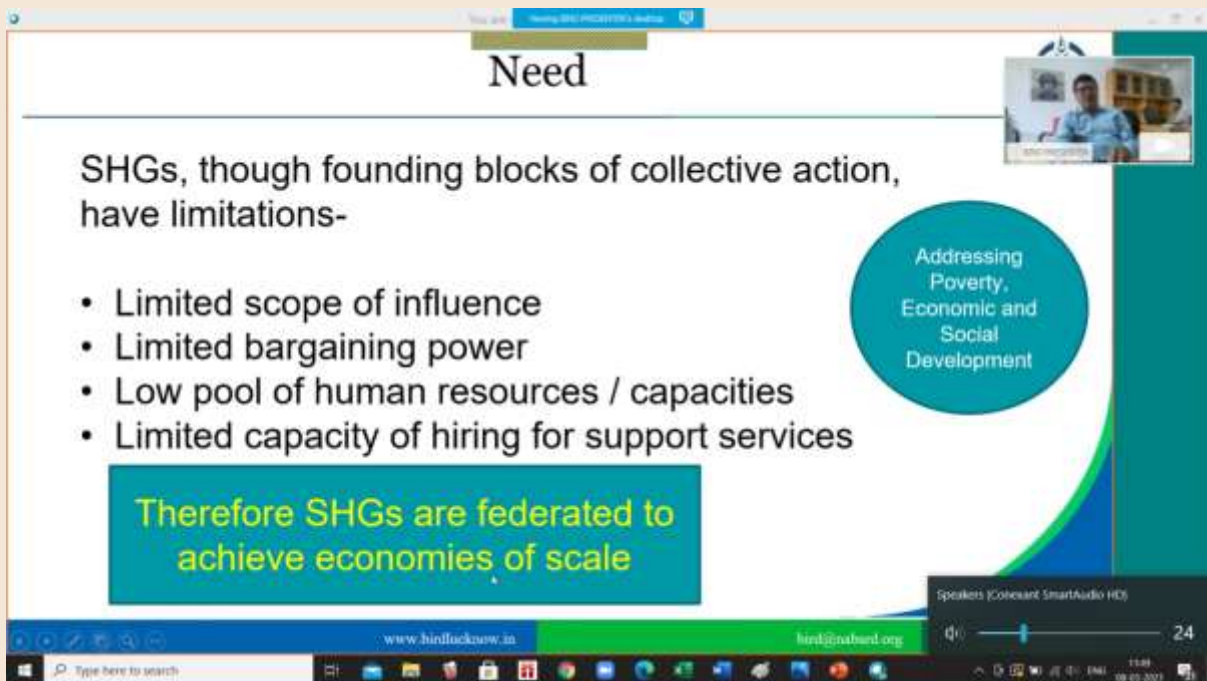
