ABOUT CICTAB

PROFILE :

At the instance of FAO CICTAB was set up by the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India as an autonomous institution with its head quarters at Vaikunth Mehta National Institute of Cooperative Management, University Road, Pune 411 007 (India), in January, 1983.

CICTAB became operational, initially for four countries of the region, viz. Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka and India. Subsequently in the year 1991, General Council of CICTAB decided to revive the development of CICTAB activities as focal centre of HRD efforts in the relevant fields for all the countries of the SAARC region.

CICTAB was organised on the lines of the recommendations of FAO Mission on CICTAB (Chairman, B. Venkatapiah, formerly Dy. Governor of Reserve Bank of India and with endorsement of Government consultations held at Pune of four initial member countries of CICTAB, viz. Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka and India.

SCOPE AND FUNCTIONS

While conceived essentially as a sub-regional centre for Nepal, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and India, subsequently extending its scope to all the countries of SAARC Region, it is also expected that CICTAB will provide an effective forum for exchange of experience in agricultural banking and related fields between different developing countries in Asia and Africa. CICTAB's role, thus, is comprehensive and crucial but catalytic in nature.

The functions envisaged for CICTAB are defined in terms of its role and also of the countries it is expected to serve. CICTAB's functions are thus (i) training of personnel in relevant spheres and (ii) serve as a forum for exchange of experience among developmental functionaries.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

One of the distinguishing features of CICTAB is focus of its activities on programmes and practices relating to rural development. CICTAB, therefore, endeavors, through its programmes to help develop integrated management of organizations and institutions concerned with promoting and financing rural development.

In terms of its objectives, activities envisaged for CICTAB are:

- a. To actively promote and strengthen national systems for training in agricultural banking - credit and other organisations engaged in rural financing and development.

b. To conduct training courses/workshops/seminars in India or other countries of the region on various aspects of Agricultural/Rural Financing and Development.

PROGRAMMES AND PARTICIPANTS

CICTAB's activities relate to training personnel so as to assist them in solving the problems relating to promoting and financing rural development activities as also regarding the innovative and multi-disciplinary types of Rural Development Projects and Programmes.

The countries in the region participating in CICTAB programmes have more or less common features and comparable experience and problems in their rural economy and in the various development programmes undertaken by them. The importance of personnel development in evolving a viable institutional framework for executing rural development programmes, particularly for the benefit of the rural poor recognised by all concerned.

Participants for CICTAB's training programmes and other allied activities are senior personnel in related Departments of Government, central banks, cooperative and rural development financing institutions, Banks dealing with policies and programmes of their respective institutions and trainers from national level or regional level training institutions concerned with training of personnel from Rural Financing and Development Organisations.

Fig. I: Number of programmes conducted during the years 1983-84 to 2022-23.

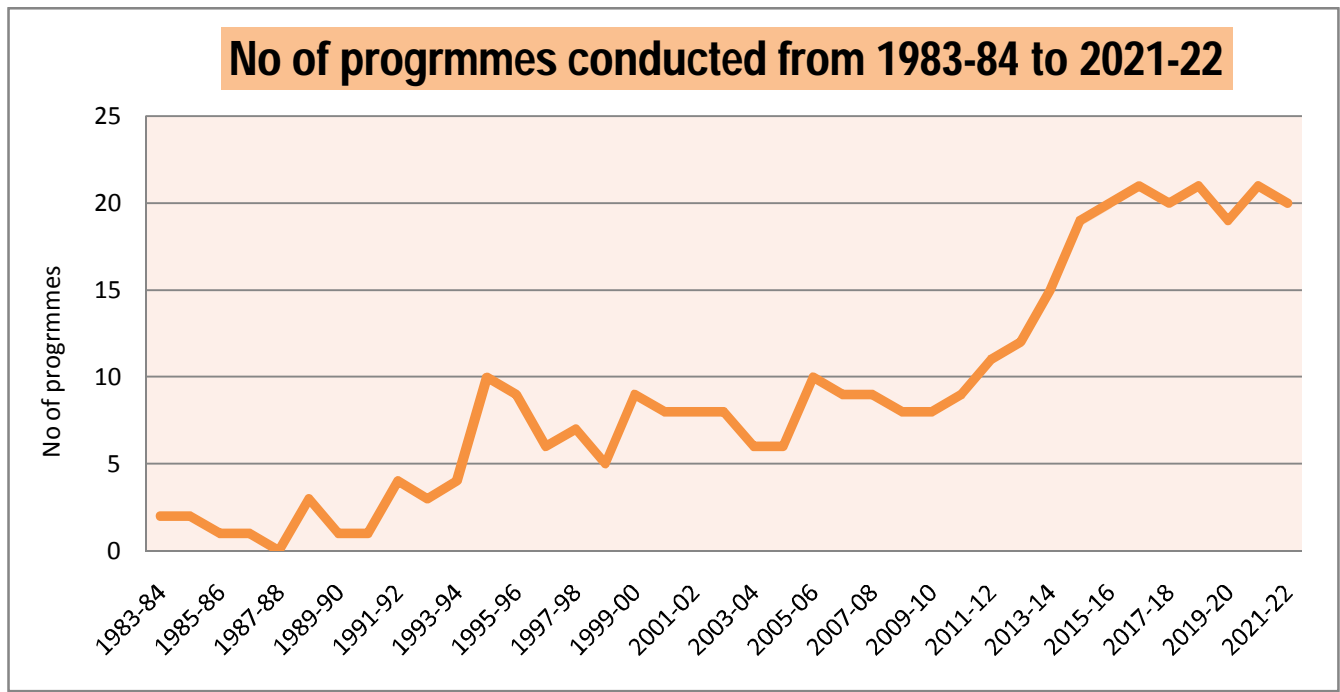


Fig. II: Number of Participants Trained during the years 1983-84 to 2021-22.

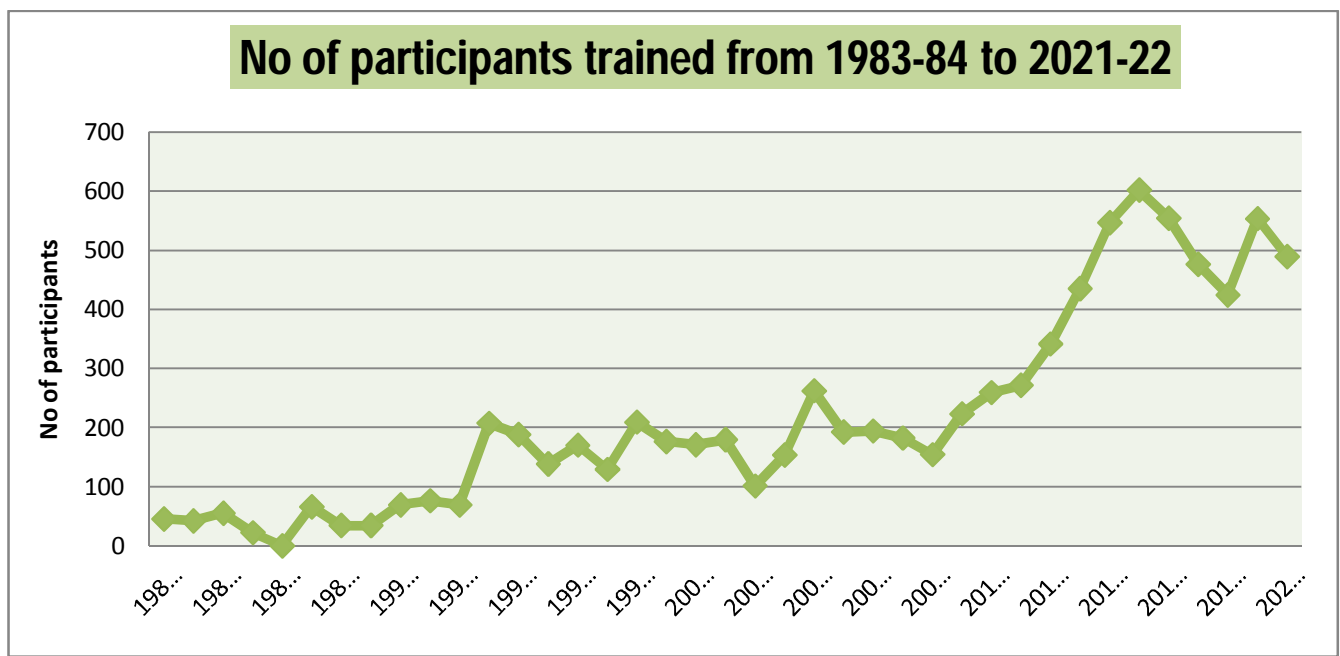
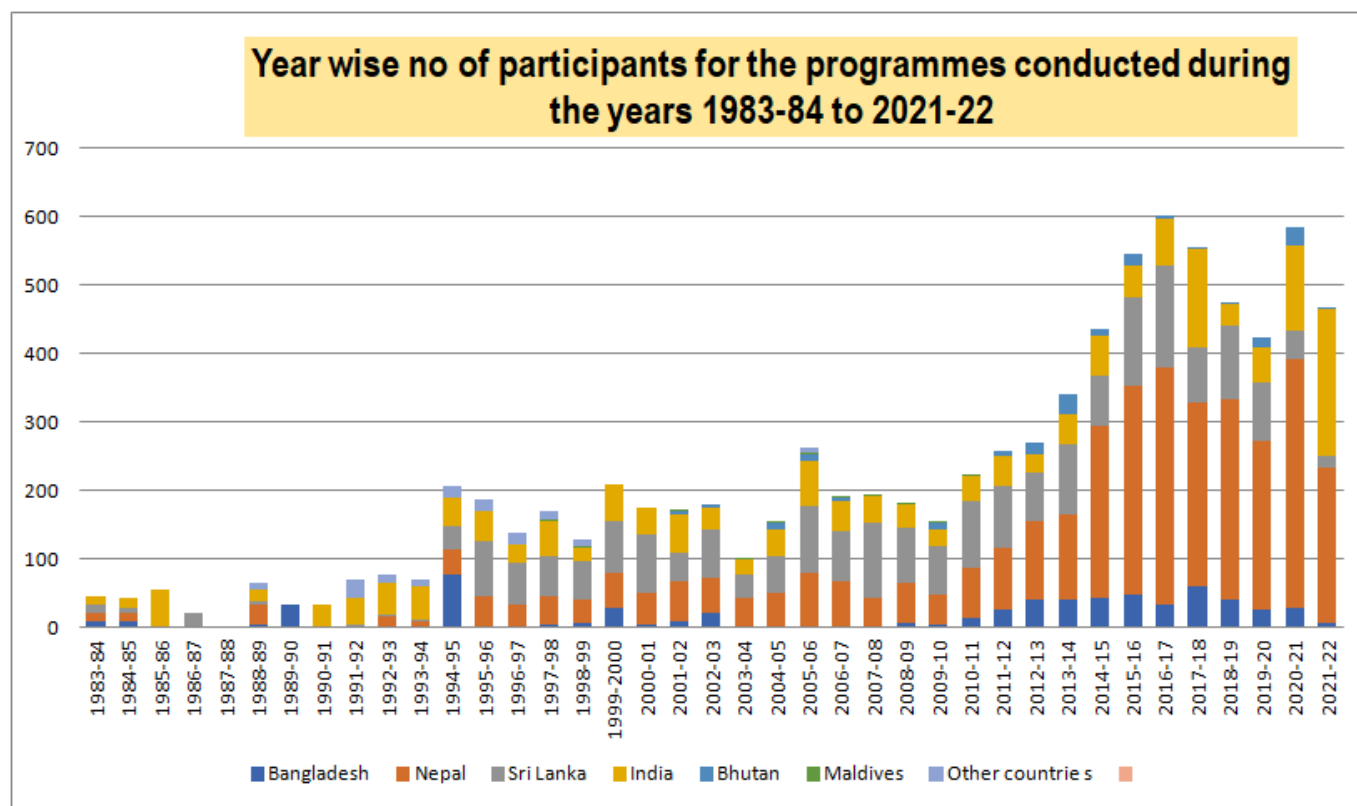


Fig. III: Yearwise number of participants trained during the years 1983-84 to 2021-22.

AN OVERVIEW OF PROGRESS AND GLIMPSES OF CICTAB ACTIVITIES 1983-84 to 2021-2022

1. NATIONAL WORKSHOPS:

FAO Mission Report (March 1980) had indicated a broad framework of activities for CICTAB especially with reference to the part it can play to help build up a National system of training for each of the participating countries. While discussing the measures for promoting national system of training it was indicated that one of the main responsibilities of CICTAB would be to assist and guide the countries in the sub-region for developing and strengthening their National systems of training so that cadres of trained professionals are built up to meet adequately the emerging needs of development oriented agricultural banking.

Objective was to help develop a comprehensive national system covering both cooperative and commercial banks. This would necessitate national level workshops for assessing the present gaps in training arrangements and identifying the measures to be taken to develop well-knit and purposeful national training systems. The first such workshop was held in India.

In view of these objectives, National Workshops designs were formulated as under:

- (i) Reviewing training arrangements obtaining in the country for personnel connected with rural banking and credit in commercial banks, cooperatives and specialised institutions.

- (ii) Consider such arrangements in light of the objectives, needs and other aspects including policies and programmes of rural development such as those concerned with larger production on the one hand and the small producer on the other.
- (iii) Suggesting framework for bringing these arrangements into a National system of training such as would adequately fulfill the objectives and policies which underlie agricultural programmes and rural development with particular reference to strengthen and develop National training system as :
 - (a) Strengthening and developing multi-level network of training arrangements/institutions with appropriate linkages and coordination at various levels(National, Intermediate and Field);
 - (b) A central arrangement to (a) to design various programmes on the basis of job analysis of different cadres and levels of banking personnel;
 - (c) to organise training of the faculty and help in the preparation of course material;
 - (d) to develop teaching methods; and (d) to evaluate training programmes.

Accordingly, CICTAB organised four National Workshop in India, Sri Lanka, Nepal and Bangladesh as under :

- (1) National Workshop to review training arrangements in India was organised from 12-15 February 1986 at VM National Institute of Co-operative Management, Pune. The Workshop was attended by 55 participants representing government departments connected with cooperation and rural development, National level training institutions, commercial banks, regional rural banks, state co-operative banks, National Cooperative Agriculture and Rural Development Banks Federation, National Council for Cooperative Training, FAO and APRACA.
- (2) National Workshop to review training arrangements in Sri Lanka was organised with Central Bank of Sri Lanka as lead institution from 31 October to 03 November 1986. The National Workshop was attended by 22 participants drawn from agricultural banks, cooperatives and government departments connected with agricultural and co-operative/rural development.
- (3) National Workshop to review training arrangements in Nepal was organised on 30-31 May 1988 with Agricultural Credit Institute of Agricultural Development Bank, Nepal as lead institution. The Workshop was attended by 23 participants representing National level training institutions, Nepal Rastra Bank, Rastriya Banijya Bank, Agricultural Development Bank and representatives of Ministry of Agricultural Finance, Rural Development and Co-operatives.

(4) National Workshop to review training arrangements in Bangladesh was organised on 3-4 April 1989 with Training Academy of Bangladesh Bank as lead institution. 34 participants representing National level training institutions, agricultural financing banks, commercial banks, National level Rural Development Board, Bangladesh Institute of Bank Management and Government Departments connected with agricultural financing, cooperatives and rural development.

2. COLLABORATIVE ACTIVITIES - PROGRAMMES :

(i) Survey of Self-Help Groups :

At the instance of APRACA the member institutions of APRACA in India were to undertake survey of self-help groups with a view to establish their linkages with the financial institutions. As a part of collaborative contribution of CICTAB in conducting these surveys and join the steering committee which was to coordinate and consolidate their survey reports of voluntary agencies/self help groups in various parts of the country CICTAB in turn had requested VAMNICOM, Pune to undertake the study on behalf of CICTAB. Accordingly, the survey of self-help groups/voluntary agencies in Tamilnadu and Kerala were undertaken by the faculty of VAMNICOM on behalf of CICTAB in 1986. The report prepared on the basis of this survey has been incorporated in the country report on the survey by NABARD for APRACA.

(ii) Country Plan of Study Visits by APRACA members in India :

It was decided in the meeting of the APRACA member institutions of India held at NABARD, Bombay on 15 May 1987 that CICTAB may assist in preparing the country plan of study visits by Indian member institutions during the years 1987 and 1988. CICTAB had undertaken to prepare such programmes on behalf of the member institutions of India as a part of its collaborative efforts in APRACA activities.

CICTAB prepared a detailed plan of study institution-wise and subject-wise on the lines of the focus of study during these visits as indicated by APRACA and requested the member institutions in India to indicate the number of representatives proposed to be deputed for study visits as well as to indicate the areas/institutions and countries they would like to depute their members of study.

CICTAB compiled and classified the proposals as received in terms of the countries/institutions/areas and number of persons to visit group of countries and sent these details to NABARD for convening the meeting of the member institutions to finalise the actual programme of study visits as well as the allocation of APRACA assistance to member institutions of India for undertaking the study visits.

(iii) Consultation for preparing Course Outline and Material for South Asian Trainers Training Course :

It was decided in the APRACA meeting of Indian member institutions held at NABARD, Bombay on 15 May 1987, that CICTAB should be designated as focal point in India for preparatory work for the above consultation and also for subsequently conducting South Asian Trainers Training Programme of APRACA.

In terms of the above decision and as part of collaborative efforts towards conducting APRACA activities, CICTAB had constituted a team of training experts consisting of representatives from VAMNICOM, CAB, NIBM, NABARD and SBI. CICTAB has collected training material in respect of trainers training programmes from these institutions. The compiled training material was considered at the consultation of trainers organised by APRACA in collaboration with CICTAB at CAB, Pune during the period 21-25 March 1988.

(iv) At the instance of the Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India CICTAB provided academic collaboration in organising and conducting APRACA "Workshop on Linkages of Self-help Group with Banks" in the month of December 1990 at NIBM.

3. CICTAB DELEGATION'S VISITS TO MEMBER COUNTRIES

(i) DELEGATION TO NEPAL :

As per the decision of the General Council and Managing Committee of CICTAB, the programme of visit of the CICTAB Delegation to Kathmandu, Nepal was arranged for the period 6-11 September, 1992. The objective of the delegation visit was to have an opportunity of personal dialogue and discussions with the various authorities and national level agricultural banking, cooperative and rural development institutions and their National level training organisations regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Nepal with collaborative support of these respective organisations and institutions.

CICTAB Delegation consisted of Dr. BC Sharma, IAS, the then Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Chairman, Managing Committee of CICTAB as leader of the Delegation, Shri KC Srivastava, IAS, Director and Prof. (Dr.) DR Oza, Consultant, CICTAB. During the course of the programme of visit, the Delegation had very useful discussions with the authorities of Government and National level agricultural banking and rural development institutions of Nepal.

During the course of discussions with these authorities and institutions the Delegation received very encouraging response to the request of CICTAB regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Nepal mainly for the human resource

development of the functionaries in the spheres of agricultural banking, cooperatives and rural development institutions in Nepal.

(ii) DELEGATION TO SRI LANKA :

As per the decision of the General Council and Managing Committee of CICTAB the programme of visit of the CICTAB delegation to Colombo, Sri Lanka was arranged for the period from 6-12 February, 1994. The objective of the delegation visit was to have an opportunity of personal dialogue and discussions with the various authorities and National level agricultural banking, cooperative and rural development institutions and their National level training organisations regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Sri Lanka with collaborative support of these respective organisations and institutions.

CICTAB delegation consisted of Smt. Asha Das, IAS, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Chairman, Managing Committee of CICTAB as leader of the delegation, Shri KC Srivastava, IAS, Director, CICTAB, Bhagat Bista, representative of the Nepal Rastra Bank, Kathmandu, Nepal and Prof. (Dr.) DR Oza, Consultant, CICTAB. During the course of the programme of visit, the delegation had very useful discussions with the authorities of the Government and National level agricultural banking, cooperatives and rural development institutions of Sri Lanka.

During the course of discussions with these authorities and institutions the delegation received very encouraging response to the request of CICTAB regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Sri Lanka mainly for the human resource development of the functionaries in the spheres of agricultural banking, cooperative and rural development institutions in Sri Lanka.

(iii) DELEGATION TO BANGLADESH :

CICTAB delegation to Bangladesh, consisting of Smt. Asha Das, IAS Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Chairperson, Managing Committee of CICTAB as leader of the delegation, Shri KC Srivastava, IAS, Director, CICTAB, Shri MN Caffoor, Deputy General Manager, People's Bank and Prof. (Dr.) DR Oza, Consultant, CICTAB visited Bangladesh during the period 12-18 April 1994. During the course of the programme of visit, the delegation had very useful discussions with the authorities of the Government and National level agricultural banking, cooperative and rural development institutions of Bangladesh.

(iv) DELEGATION TO MALDIVES

With a view to initiate efforts in the remaining countries of the SAARC region by arranging personal discussions with the authorities and National level institutions of Maldives to discuss various aspects of developing CICTAB activities in Maldives, the visit of CICTAB officials under the leadership of Shri Bhagat Singh, Additional

Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India and Chairman, Managing Committee of CICTAB was arranged from 04-09 May, 1998. The team included, besides the Chairman, Dr. MC Bhandari, Director and Prof. (Dr.) DR Oza, Consultant of CICTAB.

During the visit, CICTAB Delegation visited all the relevant authorities and institutions including Hon'ble Minister of Fisheries and Agriculture, Republic of Maldives, Director General, Ministry of Fisheries and Agriculture, General Manager, Bank of Maldives, Director, Department of External Resources, Director, Ministry of Planning and Director Maldives Centre for Management. During the course of visit the team had very useful discussions with these respective authorities, who positively responded to the initiative of CICTAB in developing HRD activities in the spheres of agricultural banking and rural development and expressed that they would explore the possibility of helping the development of CICTAB activities in Maldives and for the relevant personnel of Maldives.

(v) DELEGATION TO BHUTAN :

With a view to have personal discussions with authorities in the Government and National level financing and development institutions/agencies in Bhutan regarding the development of CICTAB activities in Bhutan and for the personnel of Bhutan, CICTAB delegation under the leadership of Shri Bhagat Singh, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India and Chairman, Managing Committee and consisting of DR. B. B. Barik, Director, VAMNICOM and CICTAB and Dr. Oza, Consultant, CICTAB visited Thimphu, Bhutan for the period from 08-11 January, 2001.

The visiting team of CICTAB officials had details discussions with the authorities in respect of various aspects relating to :

- i) deputing participants to the programme being conducted by CICTAB in different countries of the SAARC Region.
- ii) sponsoring and organising need-based programmes mainly for the development of personnel of Bhutan along with participants of CICTAB countries in Bhutan and
- iii) request for formally joining the membership of CICTAB by various authorities and institutions by paying a membership of US\$ 500 and thereby join the General Council of CICTAB to guide the future development of CICTAB activities.

The delegation had a very encouraging response from these authorities and institutions visited and as a result, CICTAB has received 3 membership from Bhutan viz. (i) Ministry of Agriculture, (ii) Royal Monetary Authority and (iii) Bhutan Development Finance Corporation.

4. EXPERT GROUP TO REVIEW CICTAB PROGRAMMES:

General Council of CICTAB constituted expert group consists of Prof Dinkar Rao of NIBM, Prof. Mohanan of NIRD and Shri Srinivasan, Chief General Manager, NABARD to review the nomenclature, design and content of all the programmes being conducted by CICTAB.

Expert group considered the tabulated suggestions of member institutions of CICTAB in member countries in detail and recommended revised format of programmes to be followed from calendar of programmes 2005-06.

5. Roadmap/ RESEARCH COORDINATION COMMITTEE :

Centre for International Cooperation and Training in Agricultural Banking (CICTAB) under the guidance of Dr K K Tripathy, Director, CICTAB formed the Research Coordination committee in February 2020 to expand its scope in research. The idea behind the formation of this committee was to review research studies and evaluate project in the areas of rural financing, financial inclusion, rural development, cooperative development and related areas.

6. TRAINING COURSES AND OTHER PROGRAMMES - (2021-2022) :

1. During the period 2021-22, CICTAB conducted 20 programmes, all with Inter Regional / International participation under the sponsorship of and/ or with active collaboration of member institutions in member countries of CICTAB.
2. Course design and contents of these programmes were suggested by expert group constituted by General Council of CICTAB in consultation with respective sponsoring member institutions and their lead National level training institutions - where the programmes were generally organized and conducted.
3. Programme design and contents are further being revised/modified from time to time to reflect the evaluation feedback of the participants and to make the courses more relevant to the training needs of participants, member institutions and member countries.
4. CICTAB is glad to record its grateful acknowledgement of the comprehensive support of the member institutions in member countries in sponsoring / collaborating in the successful conduct of these programmes for the benefit of participants from agricultural banking, cooperatives and rural development institutions in member countries and other countries of SAARC Region.
5. CICTAB conducted third Research Coordination Committee meeting on 21st December 2021 with Nodal officers of CICTAB Member Institutions at VAMNICOM Pune. Meeting was conducted to strengthen the research

activities on compilation of success stories / best practices followed in CICTAB Member Institutions.

Details of these 356 programmes in terms of period/year, sponsoring/collaborating organizations, number of participants and participating countries are elaborated in Annexure-I.

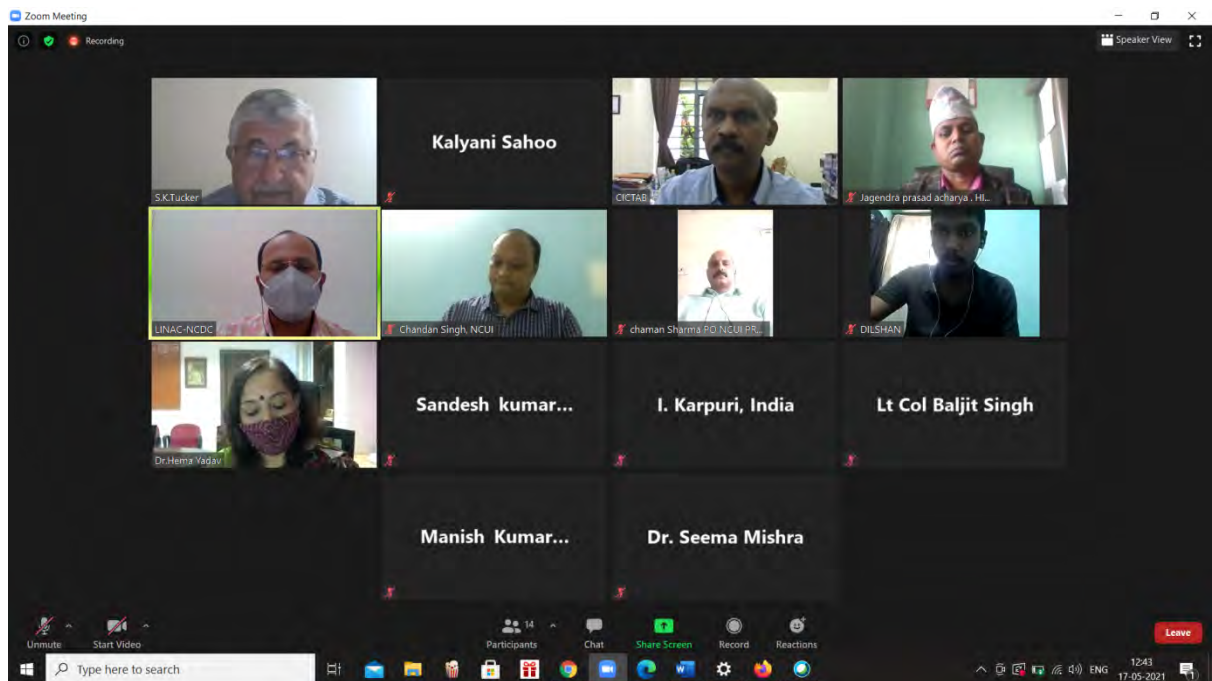

A total number of 17 participants (Nepal 11, India 3, Bhutan 2, Sri Lanka 1) participated in the programme.

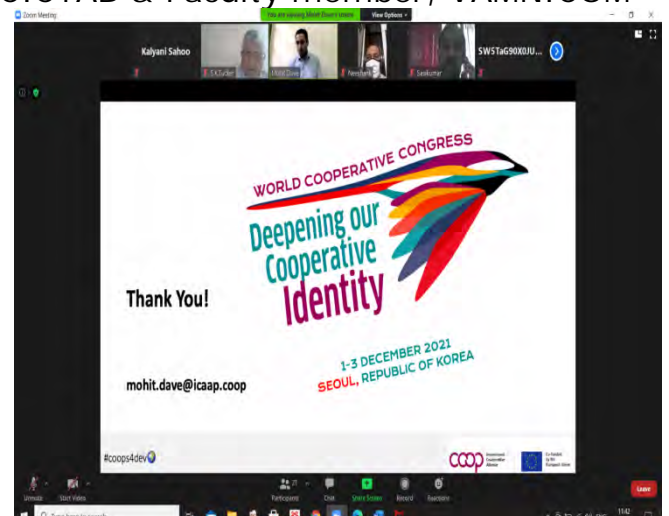
The content of the programme mainly included sessions by various Faculty members from VAMNICOM, NCDC & LINAC on the following topics :

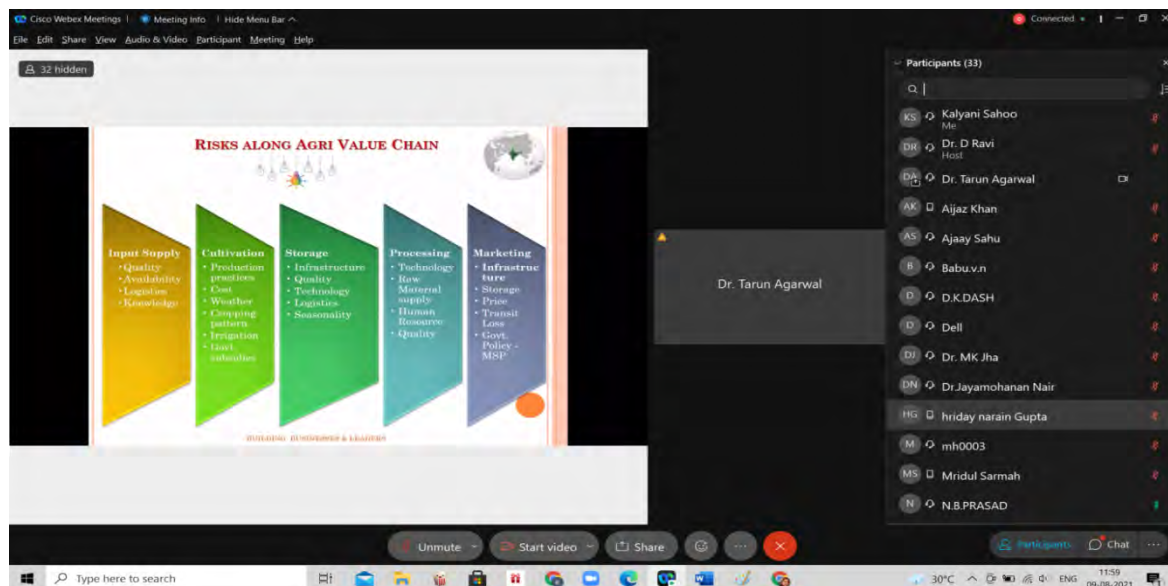

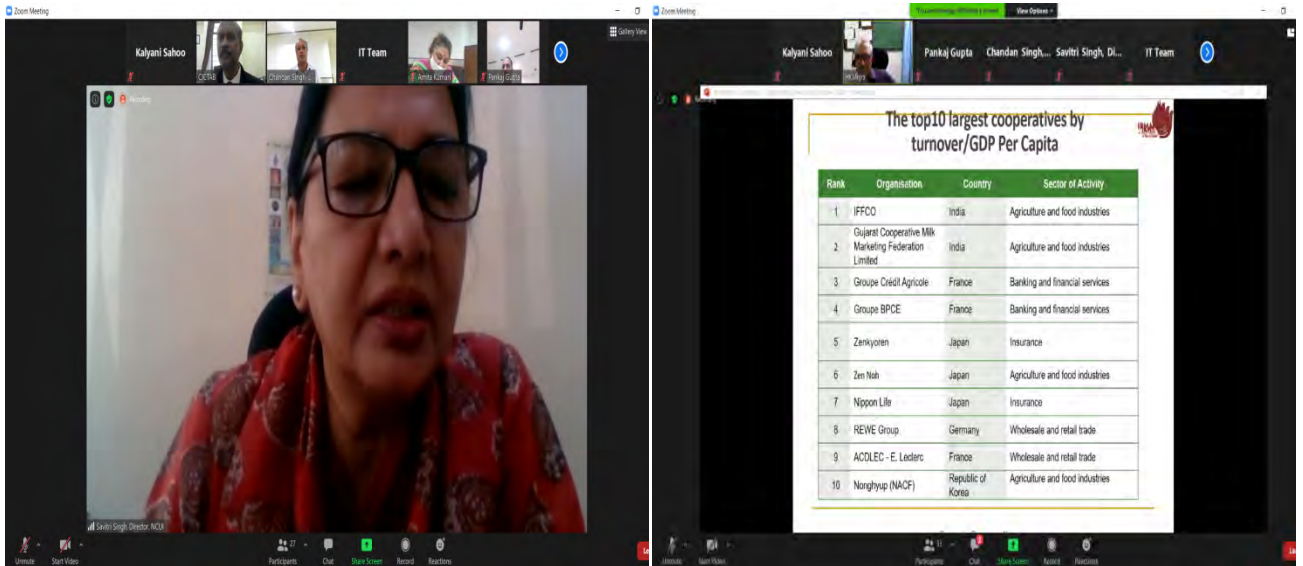
A total number of 37 participants attended the on-line programme from two countries viz., Srilanka and India. There were 36 participants from India and 1 participant from Srilanka.

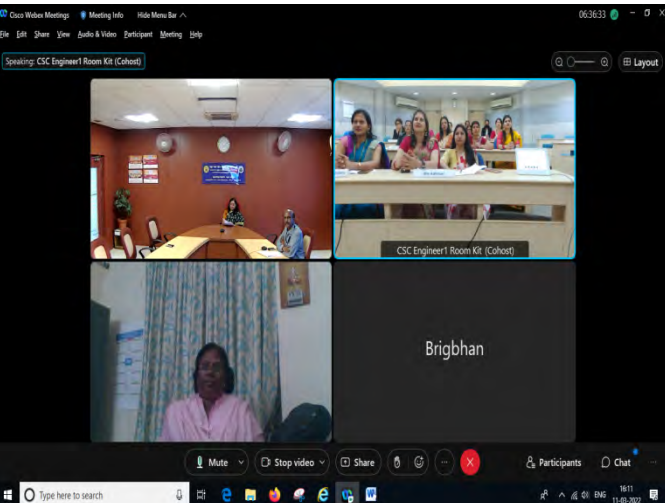
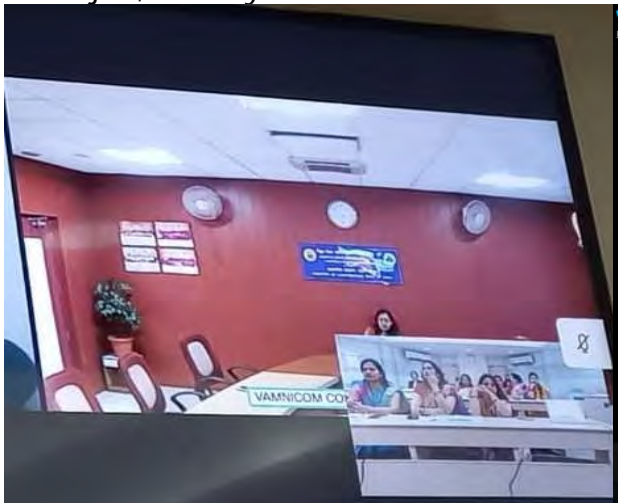

Road map for CICTAB Activities

1 Introduction and Background

1.1 Centre for International Cooperation and Training in Agricultural Banking (CICTAB), on the basis of recommendation of the Food & Agriculture Organization (FAO) was set up by the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India in January 1983 as a society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare decided to place the CICTAB within Vaikunth Mehta National Institute of Co-operative Management, (VAMNICOM) Pune.

1.2 The objectives of CICTAB were to establish administer and manage activities for promoting international cooperation for training in Agricultural banking and facilitating exchange of experience and information on national systems of finance and banking for agriculture and rural development with special reference to rural poor in developing countries particularly those covered by Asian and Pacific Regional Agricultural Credit Association (APRACA) and African Regional Agricultural Credit Association (AFRACA).

Keeping in view the vast area of operation of CICTAB, the Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. Of India decided in one of its meeting held in 1991 that CICTAB needs to be a focal centre for undertaking human resource development activities for the executives connected with rural development, agricultural banking and cooperatives in the countries of the SAARC Region. Since then CICTAB is implementing its activities with the help of member institutions in the SAARC Region.

1.3 Management of CICTAB is vested with the General Council and Managing Committee. While General Council is headed by the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. Of India the Managing Committee is chaired by the Additional Secretary (Credit & Coop), Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. Of India. Copy of Memorandum of Association with Rules and Regulation for conduct of business in CICTAB is at Annexure – I.

The first Managing Committee of CICTAB consisted of 10 members excluding Chairman. Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture was the Chairman whereas Ministry of Rural Development, Ministry of Finance, RBI (College of Agricultural Banking), NABARD, National Institute of Bank Management, NIRD, NCUI, Indian Bank Association were the member institution. The first meeting was convened on 2nd March, 1983.

Due to concerted efforts of CICTAB Secretariat, its membership has now risen to 35. The list of CICTAB member organisations may be seen at Annexure – II. So far, General Council of CICTAB has met 21 times and the Managing Committee has convened 48 meetings. The last meetings of General Council and Managing Committee were held on 23rd February, 2018 in Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi. The minutes of the last meetings of General Council and Managing Committee are at Annexure – III. In the meeting while reviewing the activities of CICTAB the General Council and the Managing Committee felt the need of revamping CICTAB considering the present development scenario and required financial and administrative assistance to implement the mandated activities.

2. CICTAB Activities and present Status

2.1 CICTAB has only concentrated on one activity viz., imparting training to invited participants on Agri banking. No other mandated activities like convening National / International Workshop, contemporary research studies, instituting awards, fellowship, prizes, scholarships, preparation of case studies on public policies and programmes, conducting special courses for institutions financed by International Finance Organisations, etc. could be taken up.

From 1983 till March, 2018, CICTAB has successfully conducted 275 programmes in consultation with its member institutions. A review of programmes conducted so far by CICTAB reveals that training programmes conducted by it are primarily based on themes like Rural credit, Micro finance, Cooperation, Trainers Training and Rural Development.

2.2 In the recent years, new training programmes on Information Technology, Database Management, Digitalization in Rural Financing Institutions, Exposure visit programme on SHG/JLG, Exposure visit programme on Cooperative Business Model, Governance of Rural Financing Institutions, Agri Value Chain Financing, and Renewable Energy Management have been introduced.

3. Need for revamp of CICTAB Activities and Potential Activities

3.1 Over the years, CICTAB's role has been limited to only imparting training to select participants drawn from member institutions. Attempts have not been made to expand its scope as per the mandate of CICTAB where 15 member institutions are from India and 20 from outside India. Hence the need has arisen to review the existing activities of CICTAB vis-à-vis the provision contents in the MoU establishing the institution.

3.2 A review of the provision as content in memorandum of Association establishing CICTAB indicates that the purpose of establishment of such a platform would be fulfilled if the following activities are undertaken:

- a) Conduct of Seminars (National and International) on the thematic areas relating to agriculture finance and rural development.
- b) Documentation and publication of success stories and reach experiences of member institutions in the field of agriculture and rural developments.
- c) Institute research studies and evaluation project in the areas of rural financing, financial inclusion, rural development, cooperative development and related areas.
- d) Start of courses leading to award of certificate, diploma and other distinctions.
- e) Establishment of a query based Electronic Solution Exchange Platform

4. Financial position of CICTAB

4.1 Initially, FAO had contributed US\$38,500 (Rs. 4.71 lakhs US\$1 = Rs. 12/-) to initiate mandated activities of CICTAB during the years 1984 to 1986. Subsequently it was felt that CICTAB need a financial support to enrich its corpus and make it sustainable for implementation of future activities. Accordingly, 11 member institutions contributed 95.5 lakhs to strengthen the corpus over the years from December, 1991 till June, 2006. List of institutions contributed one time assistance to the corpus is at Annexure – IV.

Further, The CICTAB has the corpus of Rs. 400 Lakhs and other savings in Fixed Deposit Rs. 30 Lakhs.

4.2 As per the current rate of Interest, income from Fixed Deposits mentioned in 4.1 yields Rs. 28.69 Lakhs per annum.

4.3 CICTAB charges Membership fee of Rs. 39,000 per annum from Indian Member Institutions and US \$ 600 from other Member Institutions in SAARC Countries. Further Government of India provides a meagre budgetary support of Rs. 3.36 Lakhs for conduct of three programmes at VAMNICOM. NCUI also provides financial assistance Rs. one Lakh for the conduct of one programme at VAMNICOM. Further CICTAB Member Institutions - IFFCO provides full assistance to conduct one programme at FMDI, Gurgoan. NCDC, RBI-CAB, NIRDPR, NIBM NABARD-BIRD, NCUI and VAMNICOM offers programmes with minimum financial support of CICTAB. The Membership fee and financial assistance so collected per annum varies from 10 to 15 lakhs per annum as a number of members have stopped contributing annual membership fee. List of member institutions who have not paid their membership fees may be seen at Annexure – V.

4.4 The CICTAB training programmes are approved by General Council and Managing Committee and are sponsored programmes. Hence, the participants from member institutions are not charged for the course fee, study visits, lodging and boarding. Depending upon the location, institution, duration and number of participants the training cost has over the years risen from Rs. 1.50 lakh to Rs.

3.00 lakhs (for 5 days programme with 25 participants at normal rates excluding faculty support charges each).

4.5 The present demand from BIRD, Lucknow and NIBM, Pune who are our promoter institutions varies from 10.00 lakhs to 12.00 lakhs. Copies of the demand notes received from NIBM, Pune and BIRD, Lucknow are at Annexure – VI.

Since 1983, CICTAB has managed to build a corpus of Rs. 400 lakhs with another additional saving in FDR of Rs. 30 lakhs. The annual interest receipt out of corpus and other savings of CICTAB is Rs. 28.69 lakhs. If one considers other income like receipt from membership fee, TDS refund receivable and grant from Ministry of Agriculture & NCUI the total annual receipt inclusive of interest income comes to Rs. 49.5 lakhs. The annual approved budget 2018-19 for conducting only the training programmes and meeting minimal administrative expenditure comes to Rs. 81.20 lakhs. This indicates that there is deficit of Rs. 31.70 lakhs to undertake only training activities during the year 2018-19.

5. Proposed activities to revive CICTAB

5.1 The following are the summarised activities which need to be undertaken to revive the CICTAB activities and to make it a vibrant platform for exchanging ideas relating to agriculture finance and rural development.

- a) Conduct of 30 approved training programmes of 5 days each with 25 participants
- b) Conduct of at least two Seminars one in India and the other in one of the SAARC countries
- c) Documentation and publication of best practices and case studies pertaining to agriculture finance and rural development
- d) Establishing a query based E-solution Exchange platform to collect experiences and compile such experiences for e-sharing between amongst 34 member institutions
- e) Instituting at least two research projects on thematic areas covering agriculture, agriculture finance and rural development
- f) Recruiting a full time resource person on deputation either from RBI or NABARD or on contract basis to strengthen CICTAB secretariat.
- g) One time assistance for renovation of CICTAB office at VAMNICOM

5.2 The estimated total cost per annum would be Rs. 126.4 lakhs. Activity-wise financial requirement for undertaking CICTAB activities may be seen at Annexure – VII.

6. Financing revived CICTAB

The present deficit amount for undertaking limited CICTAB activities is Rs. 31.70 lakhs. In order to implement the activities for revival of CICTAB, the strength of the corpus should be Rs. 20 Cr. Considering simple bank rate of 6.5% to 7%, the annual interest earning would be sufficient to meet the expenses of the proposed activities.

Since CICTAB has already raised the corpus of Rs. 4.25 Cr., the remaining 15.75 Cr. could be contributed as one time contribution from various member institutions. An indicating share of promoter member institutions and other member institutions towards one time contribution may be seen at Annexure – VIII.

Contributing Organization will have the privilege of getting their nominated trainees (not more than 60 in a year) trained by CICTAB free of cost. Further they will be exempted in payment of membership fee for five years.
